

Another Carver Board of Selectmen Open Meeting Violation

On December 27, 2011 The Attorney Generals Office cited the Board of Selectmen for three separate violations of the open meeting law. The citations stem from attempts by the Board of Selectmen to circumvent proper public notification of the meetings at which Rick Lafonds contract extension was discussed and for voting the contract in executive session.

The Attorney General ordered immediate and future compliance and "in the interest of transparency, we strongly recommend that the Board reconsider its vote on the contract during an open session meeting." They warned the Board that future similar violations may result in nullification of any action taken.
